June 21, 1933 - May 10, 2020

Bruce Erwin Bolser aged 86 of Branch passed away Sunday morning, May 10, 2020 at his home. Bruce was born on June 21, 1933 in Detroit, the son of Walter and Violet ((Howell) Bolser and served his country during the Korean Conflict with the United States Navy on the destroyer USS James C. Owen. On April 19, 1958 he married the love of his life, Shirley Norris in Gaylord, and they have celebrated 62 years together.

After serving in the Navy, the water still called to Bruce as he worked 13 years on Lower Lakers and 14 years on the Car Ferries. Eventually he gave up the water and worked 15 years as a Paver Operator for Layman's Asphalt in Ludington. Bruce and Shirley also built and operated Bolser's Adult Foster Care Home on Quarterline Road in Scottville for 15 years. In their retirement, Bruce was proud to build a home for he and Shirley on McFall Lake in Branch where they were able to watch beautiful sunsets overlooking the water again.

Bruce will be greatly missed by his loving wife Shirley; his daughter Holly (Rick) Carr; his son Chip Bolser; his grandchildren Brittney Atman and Cassie Carr; and his great-granddaughter Aria Atman. Bruce was preceded in death by his parents and his daughters Pam and Linda Bolser.
