Marshall Joseph Wisniewski aged 73 of Irons passed away on Wednesday, December 25, 2019 at his home. Marshall was born on September 28, 1946 in Detroit, the son of Clarence and Yvonne (Michael) Wisniewski and graduated from St. Thomas the Apostle High School in Detroit with the class of 1964. On July 8, 1972 he married Leanne M. Shea on Harsens Island near Algonac and they have celebrated 47 years together.

Marshall managed several Gardner-White Furniture Store locations in Metro Detroit for over 30 years, retiring in 2004.
