Richard Ray Bettison aged 85 of Ludington went to be with our Lord on Friday, February 28, 2020. Richard was born on June 29, 1934 in Lansing, Michigan, the son of Raymond and Aloa (Moore) Bettison and was a graduate of Michigan State University. He lived in Archbold, Ohio for 25 years with previous wife Beverly Schartzler and was a member of the United Methodist church, a charter member of the Lions Club, an Assistant Scout Master, and retired from LaChoy Chinese Foods.
