Bonnie Jean Malkowski aged 82 of Scottville joined the choir of Angels on Saturday, October 21, 2017. Bonnie was born on February 18, 1935 in Reyno, Arkansas, the daughter of Ercell and Ora (Shockley) Tyler, and married Edward L. Malkowski on August 30, 1958. They have celebrated 59 years together by each other's side.

Bonnie earned her certificate and Flight Attendant Wings from the Flight Training Institute in Minneapolis, MN in 1955 and worked as a Flight Attendant for Eastern Airlines and American Airlines until her marriage to Ed.
