Clayton Lee Cory was born in Scotville, MI on September 13, 1922 to Harrison Cory and Rosella Appleton Cory. He graduated from Michigan Agricultural College with a degree in agricultural education in 1949 and later received his master's degree in education from Michigan State University.
