JANE'S OBITUARY: Jane L. Beill, aged 65 of Ludington, formerly of Grand Rapids, passed away on Monday, July 1, 2013. Jane was born on July 7, 1947 in Flint to Robert H. and Esther (Bullard) Bigler.
