Milda Marie Martz aged 85 of Riverton Township, Scottville passed away on Monday, April 10, 2017. Milda was born on July 15, 1931 in Riverton, the only child of William and Marie (Ellis) Phillips. She attended St. Mary's School in Riverton before graduating from Scottville High School. On December 20, 1952 she married Donald Martz in Ludington and they celebrated 47 years together before Don preceded her in death on August 12, 2000.

When she wasn't working alongside Don on their farm in Riverton, Milda taught piano lessons in her home and served as a 4-H Leader in the community for over 35 years.
